

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Compliance Radioworld UK

Electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) is regulated in the UK to reduce the amount of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) that ends up in landfill or incineration. The aim is to increase the recovery, reuse and recycling of products and components, reducing environmental impact and conserving resources .

Radioworld UK complies with the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations 2013 (as amended), including updates introduced by the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (Amendment, etc.) Regulations 2025 .

As a reseller/distributor, Radioworld is not classed as a producer of EEE. This means we do not pay producer registration fees or report tonnage. Instead, our obligations relate to ensuring customers can dispose of old electrical items responsibly.

Our Responsibilities as a Distributor
Under the WEEE regulations, distributors must:

Provide customers with information on how to recycle electrical items

Offer a free take'back service for old electricals when a customer purchases a new equivalent item

Display the crossed'out wheeled bin symbol where applicable

Ensure customers have access to appropriate recycling routes

Radioworld meets these obligations through our free like'for'like take back service.

Free Take'Back of Old Electricals

When you purchase a new electrical item from Radioworld, you may return your old equivalent item to us for recycling free of charge.

We ensure all returned equipment is handled through approved WEEE recycling channels.

What is WEEE?

WEEE refers to any electrical or electronic equipment that has reached the end of its life. These items often contain materials that can be recovered and reused, as well as substances that must be handled safely to avoid environmental harm.

The crossed out wheeled bin symbol indicates that electrical items should not be disposed of with household waste.
