


1. Correspondence and Notes

Included are correspondence with Rudolf Sauter, A. J. P. Sellar, over 200 pages of notes, several drafts of the acknowledgments, index, and a document dated 1893 in the hand of Galsworthy's father listing the real estate holdings and rents collected by this man of property.


